### **HAANL'S UPDATE**

HAANL continues to search for innovative ideas for its membership. Below are a couple examples of the current initiatives:

- Still challenging the FRC to agree on a fee structure for wharf usage and payment thereof.

  \*Brought back to the table in September 2023—noted that FRC is still not willing to pay the invoices from harbour authorities; HAANL will follow up with FRC.
- HAANL was seeking information on the Atlantic Fisheries Fund (AFF) about the possibility
  of being a main lead in the oil filtration systems for fishing boats—unfortunately, this
  project was not under the AFF mandate.
- Harbour Authority Seminar 2024: Through funding with a Federal Class Contribution Program (CCP), HAANL will be taking on an increased administrative responsibility for the Seminar 2024—stay tuned for further updates.
- HAANL's Outreach: Harbour Authorities in the Eastern and Southern areas of Newfoundland will be contacted for onsite visits in 2023-24; Although it's impossible to visit all HAs, your HAANL rep will do as many as possible in the time and budget allotted. Site visits to Central Newfoundland/Northern Labrador and Western Newfoundland/ Southern Labrador are planned for 2024-25. HAANL's directors will be reaching out to the HAs before visitations.

In March of each fiscal year, the membership forms are included in the Ship to Shore Newsletter mailout. If you have issues receiving the form, please contact the HAANL admin. Our membership fees of \$125, annually, remain the same.

# **Special Events**

# **Core/Non-Core/ Recreational Harbours**

### What is the difference?

- Core fishing harbours: are essential to the commercial fishing industry and are often managed by an active harbour authority.
- Non-core fishing harbours: are non-essential to the commercial fishing industry because fishing activity is very low, they typically do not have a harbour authority and are usually candidates for divestiture.
- Recreational harbours: support the recreational community.
